# **Revenue Considerations:**

- Executive Budget Proposal increases NYS State Aid especially in the Foundation Aid Category. Final state aid will be known when state budget is approved.
- Inflation Growth factor used as part of the Tax Levy Limit calculation is 2% (Tax Levy Limit- Difficult to estimate at this time without having building aid estimates from Executive Budget Proposal)
- The District is in the fourth year of a seven-year LIPA settlement glidepath payment (2023-24).
- Commercial broker secured for potential sale/ use of building(s)-(likely a multi-year process).
- Expenses funded by ARRA/ESSA Grants.

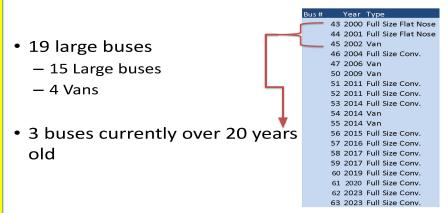
